Section 4. First aid measures

Personal precautions

Methods for cleaning up

Section 7. Handling and storage

Handling

Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see section 8). Eating, drinking and smoking should be prohibited in areas where this material is handled, stored and processed. 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Storage

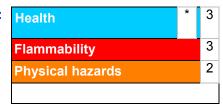
